- Brief 'how' and 'why' that encapsulates general sentiment of article*

Optional depending on time constraints, this adds depth.

BODY PARAGRAPHS

- Introduce the argument

The author poses the first argument / firstly argues / begins by arguing that ...

- Do WHAT, HOW, WHY for a particular language feature

Use the basic what, how, why structure.



ACCOMPANYING VISUAL / CARTOON

- The cartoon/photo by Author (Publication, date) satirically/sardonically comments on the issue of (issue).
- Author contends that (contention).
- The author manipulates both (technique) and (technique) when portraying
- The compounding techniques employed by Author ultimately position his/her viewership to (feeling>belief/support>action)

*If the persuasive features all contribute to the same 'why' action, then just do one large 'why' part at the end to save time for better analysis
